

# **Education Project**

## **RP 700 Final Thesis/ Project**

### **Rationale: What is RP700 Final Project: Supervised Education Workshop?**

This course is a part of graduation requirements for the Master of Arts in Christian Education program of the School of Divinity. The purpose of this project is to provide a student an opportunity to reflect critically, practically and theologically upon his/her major field of study, and to design, plan, teach, and evaluate an actual educational event in diverse learner's levels such as teacher training, parenting class, weekly worker/leader's meeting, etc. The project advisor will be assigned to supervise this project from the beginning of the semester.

### **Prerequisites for the Final Project**

The student must satisfactorily complete the courses of M.A.C.E. program. This Final Project can be offered to those who have finished minimum 45 credit hours or enrolled in the last semester before graduation.

The student must make preliminary arrangements with her/his assigned advisor for the project.

### **Procedure for the Final Project:**

1. Student develops a preliminary proposal (2-3 pages) for the project, following the outline found on proposal (title, theme, purpose, contents, audience, methods, etc.) and submits it to the academic advisor by the second week of the semester.
2. Student's academic advisor, with consent of the student, selects the project advisor according to the theme of the project, and sends inquiries to the advisor. If the project advisor agrees, the proposal should be delivered to the advisor.
3. Student starts working with the advisor for designing and executing the initial lesson plan for the workshop. The advisor should give the student time line to complete the project.
4. Prepare for the actual workshop, enlisting peer group (audience for the workshop), date & time, classroom, device, etc. and send invitations to the professors and participants (peer group) at least two weeks ahead of time.
5. Submit lesson plan, copies of all the handouts and other material before the workshop, and self-evaluation report (including theology, biblical background, and educational theories; around 30 pages) after the workshop to the project advisors.
6. The peers and participating professors will evaluate (using evaluate forms) the workshop and the advisor will grant a Pass or Fail grade to the student based on his/her evaluation and other professors and students' feedbacks/evaluations.
7. Student's obligation is to hand out 2CD after finishing all workshop procedure.

### **Workshop Location:**

Student can choose the workshop location but it would be suggested in a classroom or chapel.
