1. Regulation

The Consecutive Bachelor's/Master's (CBM) degree program affords GCU undergraduate BATS & BACE majors the opportunity to broaden their studies **by advancing their standing** and improve their career prospects. Interested students should apply at the latest one semester before completing the BA program.

Benefits of enrollment in the Consecutive Bachelor's/Master's degree program include:

- Application fee waived for the master's programs (MACE, MAMSWC, & MDIV) at School of Divinity
- For qualified Bachelor's/Master's students, reduced tuition & fees, and shortened semester hours upon matriculation into the SD master's programs
- Elimination of early decision process uncertainty at graduation
- Advanced standing may be granted to the qualified student up to 12 credit hours toward a master's program under the discretion of the Dean of School of Divinity and the relevant Program Committee.

Qualifications for this program are as follows:

- At the time of submission of the application for this program, the student must have an overall GPA of at least 3.5, with no single term GPA below 3.0, and must maintain a minimum 3.5 GPA through completion of the BA program.

Notes:

1. Depending on the level of demand, the required minimum GPA may increase.
2. For transfer students, the required GPA is based on a minimum of 63 hours of BA coursework after entering GCU and having a transfer GPA of 3.0 or higher from an approved accredited undergraduate program.
